

Guided by the spirit

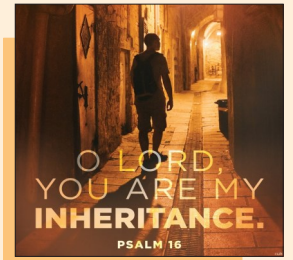
