

Be Ready for God to "Stop By"

In my experience, most people can be divided into two groups: those who are old enough to remember when you kept food on hand for company, and those who aren't.

For those of you in the latter group, let me explain. Before text messaging and social media made us all unconditionally, mercilessly reachable, people would do this thing called "stopping by." They would be passing by a friend's house, maybe on the way home from work or shopping, and they would just ... stop. With no warning. No notice whatso-

from work or shopping, and they would just ... stop. With no warning. No notice whatsoever. "I was just in the neighborhood," they would say. I remember my mother and I would do this on many a Saturday. It wasn't an everyday occurrence, but it was common enough that you had to be ready.

"Crazy," you might exclaim. "People just appeared on your doorstep? How did you cope with the uncertainty?" Well, most of us had moms who kept a little something on hand to eat or drink that was extra nice, just in case anyone stopped by. That way, we were always ready.

Today's readings are about a lot of things: prayer, hope, redemptive suffering. They're about what it means to be a Christian, and not just what it means to do Christian things.

Most of all, though, they're about readiness. If God showed up at your door, would you be ready for Him? Would you be ready for what He gives you, or what He takes away? Would you be ready for Him to interrupt the plans you have for yourself? To disrupt the idea you carry in your mind of what a servant or a steward is supposed to be?

Read your Bible. Say your rosary. Go to Mass. Get to Confession. Talk to God — every day, not just when you think you need Him. That way, you are always ready. — *Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS* ©LPi

ALL ABOUT THE 'CLYNK" PROGRAM - This program is run by Hannaford Super Market to aid in recycling of glass plastic and aluminum beverage containers. IHM parish joined the program several years ago and we have been doing it ever since. The process is simple for all those who would like to participate in it. Parishioners can take any one of the special large green bags (on table in back of church) that has our unique bar-coded tag on it and fill it with any of the recyclable beverage containers (return deposit) and when reasonably full, close the draw string and take it to Hannaford store to 'bottle recycling area'. There is a special marked bin for ***CLYNK*** bags with a hand scanner right next to it. Just scan the tag and toss the whole bag into the bin. The deposit money will then be deposited in to the IHM account for our use.

To date the monies have been used for care packages to Joseph's House in Troy; to defray the costs of several of the free books - Matthew Kelly's books; and the one by Bishop Fulton Sheen displayed in the small wall racks in our main Lobby; the stand alone book rack and the table at the back of the Church. And certainly missions such as Mary's Kitchen and Food Pantry.

We encourage all our parishioners to start "CLYNK"-ing and grab a tagged bag after Mass, and whenever filled with your recyclable beverage containers drop it off at the parish life center (if Hannaford is not in your area) and one of the IHM staff will take it to a Hannaford drop center. This is a great way for you, to help the church help others AND good for the environment at the same time. This is a win-win situation.
